
HAPPY NEW YEAR FROM THE PRO:

WINTER TIP FROM THE PRO: STAY LOOSE IN THE WINTER

One helpful tip to remember while playing your golf in the cool and sometimes cold temps is to stay as loose as possible. With some simple stretching exercises prior to all play and practice, I think you will find it lends to better swings and quite possibly greatly reduces the risk of injury due to stiffness. Extra layers of clothing and the restricted range of motion leads a player to make two basic mistakes. One is a quick swing and the second is bad tempo as a result. With a little focus on stretching you are certain to have a better range of motion and a better tempo to produce good swings.

Have a great time on the course and please consult your local golf professionals for your instruction needs and/or advise on updating your equipment. Golf manufacturers are producing the most technologically advanced golf equipment of modern day; and, when properly fit, it is sure to improve your golf games.


